


## The Associated Families of Clan Macpherson

The names of the families that have long been associated with, and supported, the Clan Macpherson are shown below. If you find yours (or that of one of your ancestors) among them, we invite you to join us in continuing that support and enjoying the privileges and fellowship that clanship provides. The procedures for joining vary slightly for each of the Branches. Click on the flag of your nation to find out what is needed for you to become a member.

Please note that we use the term "Cousins" or "Associated Families" and not Sept. The word "sept" was borrowed from the Irish culture in the nineteenth century in a mistaken attempt to explain the different surnames that can be found in a clan. The word "sept" is almost synonymous with the word "clan". A Scot would speak of Cluny and his Clan, while an Irishman would speak of O'Neill and his Sept.

Perhaps the only true use of "sept" in Scotland would be found in Clan Donald, where there are subclans. "Macdonald of Glencoe", for example, could be called a sept of Clan Donald. Still all the other surnames in Clan Donald are just that, families of the clan. As the Macphersons have no sub-clans there are no septs in the clan, only families with different surnames from that of the core family.

The Chief of Clan Macpherson, Sir William Macpherson of Cluny, approved the following names as surnames and families associated with the Clan.



**His Hei**r: William Thomas (younger of Cluny)

Clan Country: Badenoch, the upper reaches of Strathearn and Strathnairn, and parts of old Castle-

lands of Inverness, and the Lordship of Pettie.

Slogan (war-cry): CREAG DHUBH CHLANN CHATAIN!

The Black Rock of Clanchattan!

(A reference to Creag Dhubh, a 2,350-foot hill that marks the boundary

between upper and lower Badenoch.)

Followers: The Cattanachs, MacGilchynichs, (MacKenzies)\*, Clarks, Davidsons, Gillies, Macintyres, and

MacGregors in Badenoch, and certain families called MacVurich, MacMurrich, Macurrach or

other variants of MacMhurich

(\*Not to be confused with the Clan MacKenzie of Northern Scotland)

**Plant Badge**: Sprig of white heather, boxwood, or whortelberry.

Crest Badge: The wildcat which forms the crest of the chief's coat of arms, within a strap and buckle bearing

his motto: "Touch not the cat but a glove" (in Gaelic, "Na bean do'n chat gun lamhainn").

Tartans: 1. "Clan Macpherson" (red).

2. "Hunting Macpherson" (grey).

3."Dress Cluny (white).

4. A variant of "Clan Chattan" or Cattanach".

Clan Pipe Music:

Gathering: "Creag Dhubh Chlann Chatain" (The Black Rock of Clanchattan)

March: "Stheudar dhomhthinn a bhifaldhdhach aidh direach" (I must myself be going home directly)

more familiar in the Lowlands of Scotland as "Macpherson's Rant'.

Salute: "Faille Loch Duthaich" (Welcome to Loch Duich)

Lament: "Cumha Chlunaigh\* (Lament for Cluny Macpherson)
